Opening ceremony was held where Mrs. Malika Nadda introduced the resources persons and other dignitaries. The athletes then continued to practice from 4<sup>th</sup> to the 8<sup>th</sup> January 2013 morning and evening session.

Ms. Roshni Neog introduced ALP's training program to the athletes and coaches present for the camp. She then divided the floor hockey male and female teams into three groups accompanied by their coaches and had various classroom activities. The Goa chapter then left for Goa by train from Chandigarh.

On the evening of 29 January 2013 in the snowy mountains of the Republic of Korea, thousands gathered in the Yongpyong Dome, not far from the Alpensia ski resort, to officially open the start of the 10th Special Olympics World Winter Games and celebrate what is set to be an incredible week of competitions that will showcase the life-changing power of sport. More than 100 delegations from around the

world participated in the ceremonial parade of athletes in front of a capacity crowd, as they prepared for the Korean “Dream Chorus” themed ceremony which depicted a Korean-culturally inspired beautiful dream of humanity towards co-existence and harmony. Many notable sports and entertainment celebrities including Yuna Kim, Yao Ming, Dikembe Mutombo and others joined in the celebration. Korean President Lee Myung-bak and Korean President-elect Park Geun-hye, who will become Korea's first female president, were both in attendance to welcome the more than 2,300 athletes from around the world to the Republic of Korea. Ban Ki Moon, Secretary General of the U.N., provided video remarks saying that Special Olympics World Winter Games will advance dignity and opportunity of all. Live remarks were given by several others, including Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, MP, Chairperson, National League for Democracy, Burma (Myanmar) .

Emphasizing the 2013 Special Olympics World Winter Games official theme ‘[Together We Can](#)’ the World Games, Special Olympics Chairman and CEO, Dr. Timothy Shriver, said to the crowd in attendance and to viewers all over the world: “We issue a challenge to the world tonight to hear the voices of people with intellectual disabilities and end fear and stigma. Together, we can end discrimination. Together, we can change the world. Together, we will.”

For the first time in the history of Special Olympics, Special Olympics Australia has joined hands with Special Olympics Bharat to create a sports development project for the intellectually disabled. The sport chosen for the camp was Special Olympics Soccer. The camp was hosted by Special Olympics Bharat – Goa from the 10<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> April 2013 at the Youth Hostel, Miramar, Panjim – Goa.



The main aim to conduct this camp was to work together as collaboration with Special Olympics Bharat, for the upcoming Regional games to be held at New Castle, Australia from the 28<sup>th</sup> November to 7<sup>th</sup> December 2013.

Around 35 Special Athletes and Coaches from Goa, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka participated in this camp.

From Goa, around 20 athletes participated from various Special schools namely Lokvishwas Prathishthan, Sanjay School, SFAL, Disha School, St. Xaviers and Atmavishwas School.

Mr. Victor Vaz introduced the 5 probable who are selected to play for Asia Pacific Qualifier Unified Football Cup. The athletes will have to undergo different and rigorous skills and assessments before making an entry into the SOB Squad to represent India at Bangkok, Thailand in the month of June.

## Five Goan footballers for Special Asia Pacific meet

**MARATHI:** Special Olympics Bharat (SOB) and Special Olympics Australia have come together for the first time in the history of Special Olympics to work together in the best interests for the people with intellectual disability.

Two representatives from SOA are in the state to strengthen partnerships with SOB prior to the very first edition of Special Olympics Asia Pacific Regional Games which will be held from November 29 to December 7 in Newcastle, Australia.

A football camp for athletes begins on April 10 at St Cruz ground and will conclude on April 28 under the watchful eyes of Australian coach, Eddie Meechan.

“SOA has debuted Eddie Meechan, one of their emblematic football coaches to Goa to help Indian footballers for this event. Eddie has been conducting two training sessions a day with the team and working alongside the Indian coaches,” informed Victor Vaz, national sports director, SOB at a press conference here, Monday.

The selection camp concluded in Hyderabad in which over 220 athletes took part out of which five Goans – Joseph Rodrigues, Isaac Cruz,

Sougat Nolk, Saish Nolk and Saneer have been selected among the 28 probable,” added Vaz.

“I was very impressed with the talent of the Indian footballers, especially in terms of discipline. After working together with the Indian coaches, we have been able to sharpen the skills of the athletes on specific areas for the competition in Australia,” stated Meechan.

India will have a delegation of over 500 representatives which will include 400 athletes and 100 officials and field three football teams at the games besides aquatics, basketball, table tennis, badminton, squash.

“This is the first time in the history of Special Olympics

that Special Olympics Bharat and Special Olympics Australia have come together for the very first edition of the Asia Pacific Regional Games,” said Air Marshall (retd) Denzil Keelor, founder-chairman, SOB.

Dr Rufino Monteiro, chairman, Goa Football Development Council praised SOB for its recent performance at the World Winter Games in South Korea and extended his full support. “The Special Olympics Goa football team is currently the top team in the nation and the India team is amongst the top ten in the world and GFC will be glad to offer its services in conducting football camps in preparation for the world unified football championships,” said Dr Rufino.

SOB is also preparing a team that will take part in the preliminary round of the Special Olympics World Unified Football Cup which will be held from June 15 to 22 in Bangkok, where three teams from the Asia Pacific region will proceed to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil for the finals in December.

Vaz also informed that former India football team coach, Armando Gomes has given his consent to support SOB.

Sharon Nixon, national manager (communications), SOB was also present.

On the last day of the camp the athletes and the coaches gathered outside the Youth Hostel for a small felicitation and a farewell program. 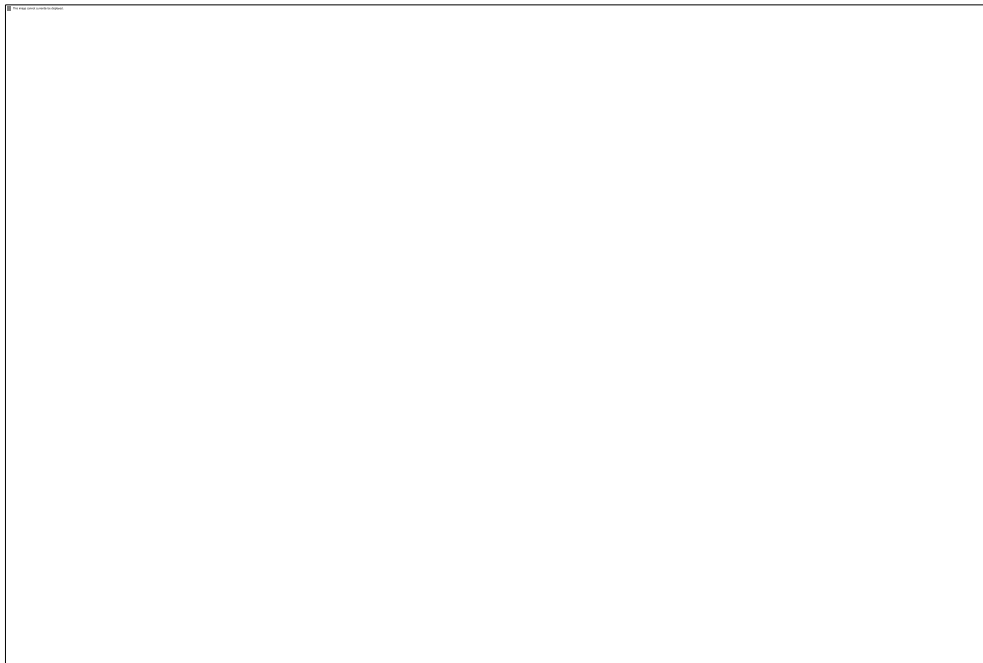
